Subject: FY 2025-2026 Youth Arts Enrichment Program Grant Award Recommendations

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Council approve the funding of 27 grants for a total of \$550,000.00 from the FY 2025-2026 Youth Arts Enrichment Program.

BACKGROUND

The FY 2025-2026 Youth Arts Enrichment Program (YEP) Grants Panel, chaired by Al Dotson, Jr., convened on September 4, 2025, to review 30 applications requesting a total of \$645,500.00. The Panel recommended funding 27 applications for a total of \$550,000.00.

YEP was created as a joint initiative of the Miami-Dade County Department of Cultural Affairs and The Children's Trust. The objective of the YEP Grants Program is to enrich the lives of children through the arts by making the arts available to more children and families throughout Miami-Dade County, whereby children will have opportunities to have positive live arts experiences through:

- Arts Instruction
- Arts Intervention
- Healing/Expressive Arts
- In-school Arts Residencies and Performances
- Out-of-School/Public Arts Exhibitions and Performances

Applicants to this program must have a minimum one-year track record of providing high quality, cultural arts programs for children and/or youth. Units of government and educational institutions such as schools, colleges and universities may not apply.

YEP is structured into three funding categories:

CATEGORY A: Provides project-based funding support to non-profit organizations for projects that provide children and youth the opportunity for ongoing/long-term direct participation in the arts, such as sequential arts instruction, after-school arts programs, in-school arts residency programs, etc. These projects must be able to measure the impact of repeated participation in these programs on the students over the project period. **Applicants in Category A may request up to \$30,000.**

CATEGORY B: Provides project-based funding support to non-profit organizations for arts enrichment experiences for children and youth. **Applicants in Category B may request \$10,000.**

CATEGORY C: Provides project-based funding support to non-profit organizations for projects that serve children, youth and young adults with disabilities through inclusive arts and cultural programs so that kids

of all abilities and their families can participate fully in the arts. **Applicants in Category C may request** up to \$20,000.

The Panel specifically evaluated each applicant organization based on the following competitive review criteria: 1) impact, 2) artistic merit, 3) management and financial capability, and 4) reach, giving priority attention to: projects that address children whose ability to participate in such programs may be limited by geography, economics or disability; and projects that provide children and youth the opportunity for ongoing/long-term direct participation in the arts.

Attached is a list describing the projects recommended for funding.

Funding for the YEP program is derived from the FY 2025-2026 grant awarded to the Department by The Children's Trust. All funding recommendations are contingent upon approval of the Department of Cultural Affairs' FY 2025-2026 budget by the Miami-Dade County Board of County Commissioners and Mayor and are subject to the availability of funds.

1 - Arts Ballet Theatre of Florida, Inc.

Grant funds will be used to support the seventh year of Arts Ballet Goes to Ojus Elementary School for 30 students Pre-K to 3rd Grade at Ojus Elementary School and at the Miami Dance, Inc. studios in Miami for a 22-week residency program. Children will learn the basics of ballet and other dance styles and will benefit from classes including an introduction to ballet appreciation, theory of dance, ballet vocabulary, and Russian ballet style.

Grant funds will be used to support Arts Beyond the Classroom for 110 students ages 6 to 15, October 13, 2025 to May 15, 2026, at Sweet Home Academy, 7th Day (SDA) Adventist School (Perrine), Young Men's Preparatory Academy (Miami) and Chapman Partnership (Homestead). Project activities will include dancing, singing, playing music, and 2-D/3-D art. Participants will engage in visual arts, music, dance, and benefit from performing skills learned for public demonstration.

3 - Brazilian Voices, Inc.

Grant funds will be used to support Music, Kids and Wellness for 600 students ages 0 to 21, October 2025 through May 2026, at the University of Miami's Bascom Palmer Eye Institute, University of Miami's Holtz Children Hospital, University of Miami's Alex's Place and the Miami Learning Experiences School in Miami-Dade County. Project activities will include music, singing, and playing percussion instruments. Participants will engage in music through songs that incorporate percussion instruments, movement, and rhythm.

HOMEGROWN: Coral Reef Senior High Residency

Grant funds will be used to support HOMEGROWN: Coral Reef Senior High Residency for up to 50 students (ages 14 to 18) from October 2025 to May 2026 at Coral Reef Senior High in Miami, FL. Lead by working theater professionals, students will engage in playwriting workshops, professional mentorship, and staged readings to develop storytelling, collaboration, and critical thinking skills. This hands-on program exposes students to script development, artistic expression, and career pathways in the arts.

Grant funds will be used to support CAP Miami Jazz Institute – The Art of Inclusion for 100 students ages 10 to 18, from across Miami-Dade County, from October 4, 2025 to May 25, 2026 at Coral Gables Congregational Church. Project activities will include twice-weekly harmony classes, instrument coaching, and jam sessions. Participants will explore unique musical ideas, benefit from freedom of expression over many musical styles, and include all children to embrace their creativity without borders.

6 - El Ingenio, Inc.

Grant funds will be used to support the Centro Mater Arts Education Project program for 90 students, ages 6 to 12 years, from October 6, 2025 to May 15, 2026 at the Centro Mater East Center in Little Havana. Project activities will include theater, movement, music, and drawing. Participants will engage in painting, singing, dancing, acting, musical therapy, and makeup. Children will learn how to improve their skills and use them in two bilingual theater productions through art activities.

Grant funds will be used to support Friendship Circle's Band Program for 20 participants ages 6 to 22, October 2025 to May 2026 at the Friendship Circle of Miami in Kendall, Florida. Project activities will include music instruction where participants will engage in rhythm, playing instruments, music education, and other musical activities. Participants will benefit from improving participant's memory, attention, concentration, and their ability to work as a group.

Participants will engage in theatre and benefit from experiencing a live production, meeting and learning from theatre professionals, and hands-on experience of the curriculum through Shakespeare.

Grant funds will be used to support Everyone Dances!, a 15-week long dance residency for students with special needs ages 13 to 18 years, taking place at ten schools including Palmetto SHS, Hialeah SHS, Cutler Bay Middle, Miami Beach SHS, and Feinberg Fisher Middle School. The unique project will culminate with a final show of 150 student dancers at the Miami Senior High School Auditorium. Now in its 16th year, this program will help students demonstrate their physical and creative abilities, self reliance, discipline, and team work.

10 - Marjory Stoneman Douglas Biscayne Nature Center, Inc.

Grant funds will be used to support A Day Where Art Meets Nature for 400 students ages 6 to 17 at the Marjory Stoneman Douglas Biscayne Nature Center in Key Biscayne, from October 1, 2025 to May 31, 2026. Led by local artists, students will engage in outdoor art sessions, exploring nature's colors, textures, and patterns through drawing, sculpture, dance, and poetry, creating beautiful artworks reflecting their appreciation of the natural world.

Grant funds will be used to support Ballet Bridges: Dance in Every Classroom - MCB's Explore Dance Residences for 300 students ages 5 to 9, from October 1, 2025 to May 31, 2026, at Title 1 public schools. Project activities will include on-site dance classes with live music by qualified musicians and performance opportunities. Participants will engage in introductory dance classes and benefit from creative expression, increased access to arts education, and potential pathways to future training.

Participants will engage in chamber music rehearsals and performances, gaining training in ensemble skills, rehearsal, performance techniques, and the development of musical and instrumental proficiency.

Grant funds will be used to support Miami New Drama In-School Residencies for 100 students ages 11 to 17, from October 2025 to May 2026 at Miami Beach Senior, Miami Coral Park Senior, Nautilus Middle School, and Miami Beach South Pointe Elementary. Project activities will include courses focused on theater history, writing, voice, movement, acting, and design. Participants will engage in theater and benefit from training in performance and creation to develop tools for artistic and personal expression.

Project activities will include four (4) professional theatre productions with Q&A, classroom prep using a study guide, and reading the show-themed book. Children will be engaged in the excitement of live educational and values-based theatre.

Participants will engage in 3D modeling, basic coding, and AR/VR creation, developing skills for future careers in creative technology and the arts.

Grant funds will be used to support The Piano Slam 2026 Poetry Competition for 800 students ages 11 to 17, From January 14 to April 30. Open to all Miami-Dade County Public Schools, the program will culminate at the Adrienne Arsht Center in Downtown Miami. Project activities will include poetry writing, performance coaching, and finalist rehearsals with a professional crew of artists and benefit from improved creative writing and oral expression, increased self-esteem, meaningful prosocial relationships, and cultural engagement.

Activities will include sequential art courses, field trips, community service projects, artist presentations, and student exhibitions. Participants will engage in fashion and textiles, drawing and portfolio, mixed media and sculpture, digital art and photography, museum experience, and benefit from foundational training in art.

Grant funds will be used to support New World Symphony's Education Concerts for approximately 1,800 students ages 9 to 17 on February 11, 12 and 13, 2026 at the New World Center in Miami Beach, Florida. These free daytime concerts will introduce major orchestral works and composers to Miami-Dade County students. A study guide will be sent in advance to all participating classes and roundtrip bus transportation will be provided free of charge.

Project activities include monthly workshops, field trips, masterclasses, and an annual full-week spring intensive. Participants will work with NDE teaching artists to hone their music skills through 21st-Century performance, musical creation, wellness, and leadership.
